About the Dell-Winston School Solar Car Challenge:
Since its inception, more than 2,000 high school students in 96 solar cars from 22 countries have participated in the closed-course and cross-country races, covering over 10,000 miles of roadway.

Who's running the roads in Mississippi? Teens, of course. But our teens are building their own wheels ... and winning titles for it.

For the past seven years in a row, the Sundancer Solar Race Team from Houston, MS, has won 1st place in the Open Division of the Dell-Winston School Solar Car Challenge. Launched in 1993, the educational program was designed to teach high school students how to build roadworthy solar cars. And for years, Mississippi's students have risen to the challenge. (Also, in 2007, a team from Choctaw placed 3rd in the Open Division, and teams from Decatur and Ocean Springs placed 1st and 3rd, respectively, in the Classic Division.)

These kids beat out teams from across the U.S. ... and several other countries ... with their ingenuity, determination, intelligence and spirit. Now, that's a bright reflection on the state of Mississippi!
